



Carbondale Minister Dies

The Rev. Ezra LeRoy Simpkins, minister of the First Apostolic Church in Carbondale, died at 9:15 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 11, 1976 at Doctors Memorial Hospital. He was 63.

The Rev. Mr. Simpkins was born in Brownstown on July 23, 1912, the son of George and Mary Shuck Simpkins. He married Pearl Harrison. The Rev. Mr. Simpkins resided in Carbondale at 518 N. Almond St. He had been minister of the First Apostolic Church since 1960.

Survivors include his wife; sons Theodore G. Simpkins of Bloomington, Ind. and Arthur of Richmond, Ind.; daughter, Evangeline Rodenbush of Accra, Ghana, West Africa; Mary Jones and Cheryl Simpkins, both of Carbondale; stepsons, David Froese and Nathan Froese, both of Texas City, Tex.; stepdaughters, Donna Granchay of Houston, Tex., and Gloria Webb of Pine

Services will be at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at the First United Methodist Church, with the Rev. M. J. Wolff and the Rev. S. W. Chambers officiating. Burial will be in Oakland Cemetery.
